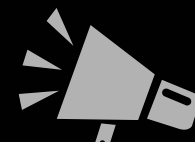

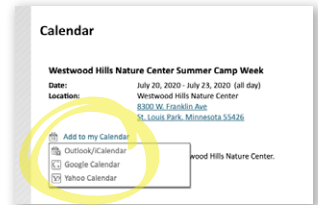
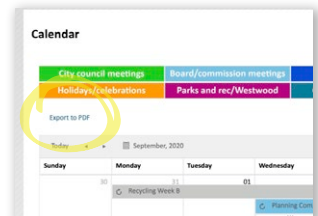

4. Click on an event on the calendar. In the popup box, click "view details."

Use click on an event and use the "Add to my Calendar" link to add it to Outlook/iCalendar, Google or Yahoo.

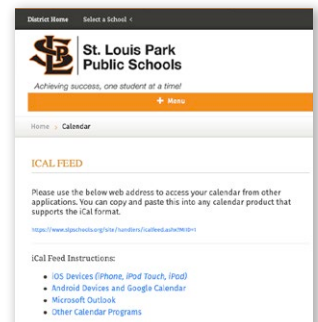

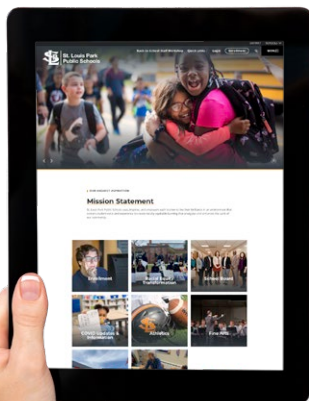
